



Gzb stretch of Delhi-Meerut RRTS by 2023

Ghaziabad: A segment of the Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut Regional Rapid Transit System (RRTS) corridor, from Sahibabad to Duhai, is likely to become operational by March 2023. The National Capital Regional Transport Corporation (NCRTC) is working on a plan to achieve the target. The deadline for the entire corridor—Sarai Kale Khan to Meerut—is March 2024.

Officials said the Uttar Pradesh chief secretary is likely to hold a meeting with all stakeholders, including the Ghaziabad Development Authority and Meerut Development Authority, on April 29 to discuss the project.

Talking about the progress of the project, he said for the 17km stretch, works like road widening, tree cutting, geotechnical investigation, detailed designing and appointing consultant for station design are on. Civil work on the stretch will be taken up in two phases and the contract will be awarded soon, said the official.

A GDA official said NCRTC needs land near Hindon Motel through which the proposed corridor will pass. "We have apprised the Meerut divisional commissioner of the NCRTC's request. Also, a request for 8.5 acres near the elevated road at Vasundhara has been made by NCRTC, which it plans to use for casting yard. It is being looked into," said VN Singh, chief engineer, GDA.


UP Chief Secy To Meet Stakeholders on April 29

The National Capital Regional Transport Corporation (NCRTC) is working on a plan to achieve the target. The dead-line for the entire corridor—Sarai Kale Khan to Meerut—is March 2024.

Officials said the Uttar Pradesh chief secretary is likely to hold a meeting with all stakeholders, including the Ghaziabad Development Authority and Meerut Development Authority, on April 29 to discuss the project.

"There are three levels of monitoring or coordination committees that have been constituted to ensure that work on the proposed RRTS corridor



happens without any impediment and the UP chief secretary, in the capacity of the convener of one such committee, has convened a meeting that is likely to take place on April 29." said an official. "This is to ensure that all problems coming in the way of the corridor are addressed and solved without delays. The government wants the first RRTS train operation

on the 17km route between Sahibabad and Duhai to start by March 2023. The deadline (for the entire stretch) is 2024," the official added.

Talking about the progress

of the project, he said for the 17km stretch, works like road widening, tree cutting, geotechnical investigation, detailed designing and appointing consultant for station design are on. Civil work on the stretch will be taken up in two phases and the contract will be awarded soon, said the official.

A GDA official said NCRTC needs land near Hindon Motel through which the proposed corridor will pass, "We have apprised the Meerut divisional commissioner of the NCRTC's request. Apart from that, a request for 8.5 acres near the elevated road at Vasundhara has been made by the NCRTC, which it plans to use for casting yard. It is being looked into," said VN Singh, the chief engineer, GDA.

The 82 km Delhi-Ghaziabad-Meerut RRTS corridor, from Sarai Kale Khan in Delhi to Modipuram in Meerut, will have four stations in Ghaziabad — Sahibabad, Ghaziabad, Guldhar and Duhai. The cost of the entire corridor has been pegged at Rs 3,0724 crore out of which, the UP government's share will be Rs 6,500 crore.

Once completed, trains with an average speed of 100kmph will cover the 82km in 55 minutes.
